About the Community Neighbourhood Grant 2025

If you're part of a small group or organisation and you've got a plan to make your neighbourhood better — this grant could help you bring it to life.

Big changes often start small — with a good idea, a few passionate people, and a community that cares. The **Community Neighbourhood Grant** is here to support those small, grassroots groups working hard to make life better in their local area. Whether it's a new project to bring neighbours together, improve a shared space, or tackle something that matters to your community — this grant is designed to help you make it happen. It's all about supporting the people who know their place best. The ones already making a difference, and the ones with ideas that could spark something new.

What's it for?

This grant is for **new projects only** — fresh ideas that haven't started yet. If you've got something ongoing, this particular fund isn't the right fit. But if you're dreaming up something new, we'd love to hear about it.

What can it cover?

There are two types of funding available, but you can only apply for one or the other. You can not mix the different funding.

- **Capital Costs** — things like equipment, materials, or improvements to spaces.
- **Revenue Costs** — things like staffing, training, or running costs for your new project.

Eligible applicants must be delivering in Doncaster and include:

- Not-for-profit voluntary or community organisations
- Registered charities
- Faith-based organisations
- Not-for-profit companies, Community Interest Companies (CICs), or social enterprises

Due to the total funding amount, a second round of applications will depend on the volume of successful applications received in the first round and cannot be guaranteed.

This grant is all about meeting real needs — the ones that come straight from the people who live here. Through conversations with residents across Doncaster, we've heard what really matters to them. The priorities below reflect what's important to them. So, when you're putting together your application, take a moment to reflect:

- **How does your idea speak to what people have said is most important?**
- **How could it help make life better in your neighbourhood?**

this grant is here for: helping communities shape their own future, so show us how your project connects with one or more of the priorities in your community.

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Capital Funding: for new projects that shape your space

If you've got a new idea that needs tools, materials, or improvements to get off the ground — this funding stream is here to help.

Capital funding is available for new projects only. It's designed to support the practical things that help bring your vision to life — whether that's equipment, repairs, or making spaces more welcoming and accessible. Here are just a few examples of what this funding could cover:

- Buying equipment like tables, chairs, or IT kit
- Refurbishing or repairing buildings
- Improving outdoor spaces — think pathways, fencing, woodland trails
- Making places more accessible for everyone

What we're especially keen to support:

We're particularly interested in projects that:

- Protect and celebrate heritage buildings
- Improve the local environment
- Bring people together through arts and culture
- Help create healthy, warm homes across Doncaster

For example, a group might use funding to buy heat-mapping equipment — helping residents spot heat loss in their homes and improve their wellbeing.

If your project involves improving a green space, that's great — as long as it benefits the wider community. Just make sure you've got written permission from the landowner if the space isn't yours and include it with your application.

Revenue Funding: for new ideas that make a real difference

This funding stream is here to help you launch **new projects** that offer real, practical support to households who need it most — and that build long-term solutions to everyday challenges.

We're looking for ideas that don't just respond to crisis but help prevent it. Ideas that bring people together, build skills, and strengthen communities from the inside out.

Here are just a few examples of the kinds of activities this funding could support:

- Tackling food insecurity before it starts
- Creating spaces for community learning and education
- Building bridges between generations through shared learning
- Training volunteers or developing peer-led support networks
- Strengthening partnerships between local services
- Offering advice, guidance, and signposting
- Setting up sustainable food pantries or community kitchens
- Running activities that boost local resilience and wellbeing

We welcome a wide range of creative and collaborative proposals. When budgeting for training or resources, we encourage applicants to use **Doncaster-based suppliers** wherever possible to help strengthen the local economy.

How much can you apply for?

You can apply for up to £2,000 to help bring your new idea to life. There's no minimum amount — so whether your project is big or small, we'd love to hear about it.

Just a couple of things to keep in mind:

- Each organisation or group can apply once only
- You'll need to choose either capital funding or revenue funding — you can't mix the two in the same application

Who can apply?

Monies from the fund will only be paid into a business bank and cannot be paid directly to individuals or un-constituted groups.

Individuals or groups who are un-constituted and/or do not have a bank account are advised to contact your local Well Doncaster Officer, in the first instance, who will be able to support you to become a constituted group. You can find their details at the end of this guidance pack.

A few things to keep in mind before you apply

We want to make sure your application has the best chance of success — so here's a quick guide to what isn't covered by this grant.

It's all about supporting new, community-led ideas that benefit the wider neighbourhood. That means there are a few things we can't fund, even if they're important in other ways. Take a look at the list below before you apply — and if you're unsure about anything, just ask. We're here to help.

- Activities promoting religious beliefs.
- Political activities.
- Goods or services that have already been purchased or ordered.
- Activities outside of the Borough of Doncaster.
- On-going organisational running costs.
- Trips and holidays.
- Costs that are already included within and funded by an existing grant or contract.
- School activities that are included within the curriculum (activities led by schools that engage the community will be eligible/considered).
- Endowments / loan repayments.
- Items that can only benefit an individual.

Monitoring, evaluation and celebrating success

Sharing your story — and showing your impact

We want to shine a light on the brilliant work happening across Doncaster's communities — and that starts with you.

If your application is successful, we'll ask you to share a few things with us to help show the difference your project is making. These are a required part of the funding, but don't worry — your Well Doncaster Officer is here to support you every step of the way.

Here's what we'll need:

- A case study — this could be a short write-up, some photos, or even a quick video
- Evidence of spend — like receipts or invoices
- A completed Community Wealth Builder (CWB) monitoring form

When to send your documents

If you've received Capital Funding:

- Send your spend evidence within 30 days of receiving the payment
- Send your case study and CWB form within 3 months of the spend date

If you've received Revenue Funding:

- Send all your monitoring documents within 3 months of receiving the funding

Thinking of applying? Here's when to get your form in

Round 1 Applications

- Open: Monday 25th August 2025
- Close: Friday 26th September 2025 at 6:00pm
- Decisions expected by: Friday 17th October 2025 (Subject to volume of applications)

Round 2 Applications (subject to available funds)

- Open: Friday 24th October 2025
- Close: Friday 14th November 2025 at 6:00pm
- Decisions expected by: Friday 5th December 2025 (Subject to volume of applications)

Applications must be submitted through the MS Teams form, which will automatically close at the deadline. Please ensure you submit your application in good time to avoid missing out.

Important Notes

- Governance Documents: Applications **must** be accompanied by the relevant governance documents. We will not chase missing documents, and applications without them will not be considered.
- Monitoring Compliance: If your group has outstanding monitoring from previous grants, your new application will not be progressed until this is resolved.
- Safeguarding and DBS Checks: Successful applications will be subject to safeguarding and DBS checks. To avoid delays, please submit these documents alongside your governance documents if

possible. We will reach out to obtain these if your application is successful and we do not yet have this information.

Please note that due to the time constraints in ensuring that you receive the funds prior to your project, **the deadline will not be extended.** Please submit all supporting documents to Community.WealthBuilder@doncaster.gov.uk by the deadlines.

What happens when you submit your application?

- You will receive an acknowledgement message after completing the MS Teams application which you can download to save a copy of.
- You **may** be contacted by the Community Wealth Builder Team to discuss your application in more detail or to ask for documentation.
- Applications will be assessed, and decisions given via email to the one included in your application.
- By accepting receipt of the fund, you must be willing to engage with the Community Wealth Builder Project and return any paperwork required.
- Successful applicants will be required to sign a grant agreement prior to release of the funds.
- Your local Well Doncaster Officer can provide support – keep in touch with them to let them know how you are doing.
- **All monies must be spent by 31st March 2026**
- **All monitoring must also be returned by 31st March 2026**

Unsuccessful applications

The decision is final and there is no right of appeal. However, unsuccessful applicants will be referred to their local Well Doncaster Officer for support, and they may be offered further support through Community Wealth Builder.
